## COUNTY HEALTH RANKINGS 2019: CODEBOOK FOR ANALYTIC DATASETS

The SAS and CSV files provided at <a href="http://www.countyhealthrankings.org/rankings/data">http://www.countyhealthrankings.org/rankings/data</a> contain the measure value, numerator, denominator and confidence intervals, where available, for all County Health Rankings ranked and unranked measures for each county in the nation. This codebook and documentation provides the name of each variable, its data source and the years of data.

There are seven descriptive variables included for each row of data to identify what geographic area the data is for and additional information, such as if the county was ranked. These variables and their descriptions are:

- 1. statecode = FIPS State Code
- 2. countycode = FIPS County Code
- 3. fipscode = 5-digit FIPS Code
- 4. state = State abbreviation
- 5. county = County or State name
- 6. year = Release year
- 7. county\_ranked equals 1 when the county was ranked. County\_ranked = 0 when the county was not ranked. This variable is set to missing for state and nation-level data, since these are not eligible to be ranked.

Each measure variable name is coded with a measure ID. These measure IDs can be found in the tables at the end of the documentation. You will find at least five variables for each measure:

Measure value coded as v(measure id)\_rawvalue

Numerator coded as v(measure id)\_numerator

Denominator coded as v(measure id)\_denominator

Lower bound of 95% confidence interval coded as v(measure id)\_cilow

Upper bound of 95% confidence interval coded as v(measure id)\_cihigh

## **Non-standard measure variables**

**Health care provider measures:** Four measures have a "ratio" variable included. These measures and their corresponding variable are

- Primary care physicians (variable = v004\_other\_data\_1),
- Dentists (variable = v088\_other\_data\_1),
- Mental health providers (variable = v062\_other\_data\_1), and
- Other primary care providers (variable = v131 other data 1)

For these measures, we report a ratio of population:# number of providers on the website. However, in calculating the rankings, we use the actual *rate* of number of providers/100,000 population. We include both the rate (as the raw value variable), and the *ratio* (as the "other data 1" variable). If you are trying to replicate the rankings, you should use the rate rather than the ratio.

When a county has no reported providers (ratio = [population]:0), the value for the ratio variable is assigned to be the negative population value. For example, v004\_other\_data\_1 stores the ratio variable as a positive number if the ratio is XXXX:1. However, for counties that have zero providers, the value is stored as a negative number to indicate that the ratio is different and is instead XXXX:0. (For example, if the ratio is 2000:0, the value stored in the field would be -2000.)

**Severe housing problems (v136):** In addition to the standard variables (e.g. raw value, confidence intervals), there are three additional variables. These are:

- Percentage of households with high housing costs (variable = v136\_other\_data\_1),
- Percentage of households with overcrowding (variable = v136\_other\_data\_2),
- Percentage of households with lack of kitchen or plumbing facilities (variable = v136\_other\_data\_3)

**Race-specific data:** Several measures are now available by racial or ethnic group for some counties. These measures are coded as

- v(measure ID) black for Blacks
- v(measure ID)\_hispanic for Hispanics
- v(measure ID) white for Whites

**Drinking water violations** is a Yes/No variable, where a 1 indicates a "Yes", while a zero indicates a "No".
