- The <u>Stop AAPI Hate</u> coalition was launched in response to the alarming escalation in xenophobia and bigotry resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic. The coalition tracks and responds to incidents of hate, violence, harassment, discrimination, shunning, and child bullying against Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders in the United States.
- The Asian American Federation offers <u>Anti-Hate Safety Resources</u> to teach targeted individuals how
  to de-escalate threatening situations and defend themselves in the event of anti-Asian violence. The
  site offers flyers in five Asian languages and in English.

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# Resources Shared in Post-Webinar Discussion Group Session

• As our nation becomes increasingly diverse in terms of race and ethnicity, advancing health equity requires an understanding of how health and health disparities are experienced across distinct racial and ethnic populations and indigenous peoples. But when we look to existing data for answers, we rarely find this information. It is either not collected at all, or the existing information on race and ethnicity is lumped into broad categories that do not allow distinct groups to be seen. It means that decisions are being made that impact people's lives and well-being without complete information. Get the Full Picture: Advocating for Data Disaggregation by Race and Ethnicity is written for community leaders and advocates who want to advance health equity by calling for changes in the way data are collected, analyzed, and reported.
