




# ABOUT GRASSROOTS POWER PROJECT

### **Build Movement Infrastructure**


- Are our demands even up for discussion?

- Requires a strong political network, or "movement infrastructure"




## **GROWW campaigns for our future in rural Wisconsin**

In 2023, GROWW successfully supported the updated Waste Storage Ordinance and won the creation of the new Groundwater Advisory Committee, but there's still a long way to go.











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



# **SWORD & SHIELD MODEL**








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
GPP believes that to create change, we should commit to long-term strategies. First, how would you describe the difference between short and long-term strategies, and why should public health invest more in long-term strategies?




