History of policing






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History of incarceration

U.S. State and Federal Prison Population, 1925-2014







How did we get here?

Health impacts of policing & punishment

- ◆ Policing: Since 2015, more than 400,000 people have been treated in emergency rooms because of a violent interaction with police or security guards
- **Incarceration**: Each year in prison takes 2 years off an individual's life expectancy
- Extending beyond the walls of prisons/jails:
 1 in 11 people recently released from incarceration experience houselessness



What can public health professionals do?

Accountability

•Is something you choose to do

 Recognizes and requires your power, including your power to enact repair

oIs fundamentally active: it requires you to address suffering you caused by seeking to transform yourself and to mend and rebuild for others

•Deepens relationship and connection

oFosters healing and restoration

Punishment

•Is imposed by others with power over you

 Aims to diminish or contain your power, which it presumes can only be harmful

oIs largely passive: it requires you to address suffering you caused simply by suffering yourself with no pathway to provide anything to others

oSevers relationship and connection

Fosters shame and isolation










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1. Reducing the Prison Population




With an incarceration rate of 615 per 100,000 residents, Wisconsin locks up a higher percentage of its people than almost any democratic country on earth.

People First Language

- Person convicted of a crime
- Person who was convicted of a felony
- · Person who is on parole
- · Person who is incarcerated

4. Rights Restoration and Ending Permanent Punishments



- Rights Restoration: Restored rights can include the ability to vote, hold public office, and serve on a jury.
- Permanent Punishments: Restrictive laws, rules, and policies that continue to penalize people long after they have served their sentence in prison.


